Club members will be doing a Turnaround at Woodcraft on Saturday, December 6th. Club T-shirts are available for \$10.00 **Binh Pho** is trying to get demonstrators lined up for the all-day seminars for 2004. **David Ellsworth** is on tap for October. He also has a turner from the South Pacific area who should be here in June. His name will be listed in a future newsletter. 

### Wood Artist Receives International Award

Wood artist **Steve Sinner** has won a Special Citation and trophy in the 2003 International Cheongju Craft Biennale held in September in Cheongju, South Korea. His winning work, entitled “Dancers And Warriors II”, is a 27 inch high by 9 1/4 inch diameter maple vessel featuring figures of dancers and warriors in silver leaf and patina. It represents the continual struggle between opposing elements of human nature. Competition was open to artists worldwide. Over 200 artists were chosen in ten categories; 23 were from the United States. Sinner’s work is featured at **MidCoast Fine Arts Gallery** West, Rock Island, Illinois through October, and will be represented by **del Mano Gallery** at SOFA Chicago 2003.
